Pathway's Mentor Award-Leadership*

 Members should have enrolled for the Pathways mentoring program while starting to mentor and should have completed the Pathways mentoring program before filing for the award

<u>Member Award – Excellence in Club Building</u>

This award will be presented to members who have been appointed as Club Mentors / Club Coaches, and help the club to achieve distinguished status and also attain DCP >= 7 points

- Eligibility:
 - o Club Mentors for all clubs chartered from April 1st, 2021 onwards.
 - o Club coaches who have been appointed from April 1st, 2021 onwards.
 - The date of appointment of Club mentors/coaches is available at http://dashboards.toastmasters.org/UpdateReports.aspx
- Cut-off date: May 15th 2022
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022.
 For those who meet the criteria after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

Member Award – Distinguished Toastmaster

This award will be presented to members who achieve the highest educational achievement in Toastmasters, namely the Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM).

- Eligibility: Open to all members
- Cut-off date: May 15th 2022
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022.
 For those who meet the criteria after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

<u>Member Award – Stellar Area Director</u>

This award will be presented to Area Directors who accomplish the following:

- Area to be President's Distinguished on April 30th, 2022.
- All Active clubs in the Area to have a minimum of 4 trained officers by Sep 15th 2021 and Feb 15th 2022.
- Area Director Visit Report to be filed for
 - o Round#1 on/before Sep 30th 2021
 - o Round#2 on/before Feb 28th 2022
- Area Director Quality check on clubs should be submitted on time.
- Eligibility: Open to all Area Directors
- **Cut-off date:** 30th Apr 2022 (Data will be extracted from TI dashboard)
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022.
 For those who meet the criteria after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

<u>Member Award – Stellar Division Director</u>

This award will be presented to Division Directors who accomplish the following:

- Division to be President's Distinguished on April 30th, 2022.
- Area Director Visit Report for clubs in the Division to be filed for
 - o Round#1 on or before Sep 30th 2021
 - o Round#2 on or before Feb 28th 2022
- All Active clubs in the Division to have a minimum of 4 trained officers by September 15th, 2021 and Feb 15th, 2022.
- Division Director whose all base / active clubs are Distinguished and above status as on Apr 30th, 2022.
- Eligibility: Open to all Division Directors
- **Cut-off date:** Apr 30th, 2022
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022.
 For those who meet the criteria after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

Member Award - Star Area Director

- Area Director whose all base / active clubs are Distinguished and above status as on Apr 30th 2022.
- Area to achieve 10% or more Net Growth in Membership across Area including New Clubs Chartered if any.
- Area Director Visit Report to be filed for
 - o Round#1 on or before Sep 30th 2021.
 - o Round#2 on or before Feb 28th 2022.
- Area Director Quality check on clubs should be submitted on time.
- Will not be applicable if the Area Director is awarded the Stellar Area Director award.

- Eligibility: Open to all Area Directors
- Cut-off date: April 30th 2022 (Data will be extracted from TI Dashboard)
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022. For those who meet the criteria
 after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

Member Award – Star Division Director

This award will be presented to Division Directors who accomplish the following:

- Division Director whose all base / active clubs are Distinguished and above status as on Apr 30th,
 2022.
- Division to achieve 10% or more Net Growth in Membership across Division including New Clubs Chartered if any.
- Eligibility: Open to all Division Directors
- Not applicable if the Division Director is awarded the Stellar Division Director award
- Cut-off date: April 30th, 2022 (Data will be extracted from TI dashboard)
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022. For those who meet the criteria after May 15th 2022, shall be awarded individually.

Member Award - Pathways Celebrity Award

- The Toastmaster who completes ONE Path (all 5 levels in the entire path) between 1st July 2021 and by 25th April 2022.
- A Toastmaster in good standing of a club in good standing.

Member Award - Pathways Champion Award

- The Toastmaster who completes more than ONE Path between July 1st, 2021 and by April 25th, 2022.
- Toastmaster who is midway through a path in 2021-22 is also eligible.
- A Toastmaster in good standing of a club in good standing.

Member Award - Excellence in Execution

- 60% of unique members should complete any level in Pathways (excluding DTM) between July 1st, 2021 and by April 25th, 2022. (Base as of 30th June 2021)
- Clubs should have a min. of 20 members by April 25th, 2022.
- No Submission is required, and the data will be pulled from the dashboard
- Recognition for VPEs of both terms for all clubs meeting the above criteria.

<u>Club Award – Phoenix Award</u>

• A Club will be awarded the Phoenix award if they achieve DCP >= 7 points and maintain base membership (base as on 30th June 2021), thus rising from the ashes like a Phoenix.

- **Eligibility:** Only clubs that could NOT achieve "Distinguished Club" status (DCP < 5 points) until 30th June 2021 are eligible to participate.
- Clubs that achieve Golden Gavel award or Silver Eagle award will not be presented the Phoenix award.
- Cut-off date: May 15th 2022
- Award Submission by Club: Not required
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022
- Please refer **Appendix 1** for list of clubs eligible for Phoenix Award

Club Award – Rising Star Award

- A Club will be awarded the Rising Star award if they achieve DCP >= 5 points and maintain a base of minimum 20 members
- **Eligibility:** Only clubs that are chartered on/after April 1st, 2021 are eligible to participate in this award category.
- Cut-off date: May 15th 2022
- Award Submission by Club: Not required
- Award Presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022
- Please refer Appendix 2 for list of clubs eligible for Rising Star Award

Club Award - Eight-80 Membership Award

Eight-80 award Term#1:

- a. New/Dual/Reinstated Member Registration Criteria- "<u>Eight</u>" Between July 1st 2021 and September 30th, 2021, the club must have added and paid for 8 new or dual or reinstated members. Membership start dates should be July 1st or August 1st or September 1st 2021. Payments made for membership start date from October 1st 2021 during the above period would not be considered for the same.
- b. Member Retention Criteria- "80%"
 - 1) The Club must have completed the Renewal payments by 30th September 2021
 - 2) The club must have renewed for 80% or over of the existing membership present in the Membership Roster on June 30th 2021. Retention percentage of the club will be computed based on the data available on the TI dashboard/Membership roster on 30th September 2021(Finalized roster for the month of September 2021 Vs Finalized membership roster for the month of June 2021).
- o Clubs meeting the above two criteria (a & b) will be qualified for Season#1 of 'Eight-80".

- Eligibility: All clubs are encouraged to participate
- Award Submission by Club not required
- **Cut-off date:** September 30th 2021
- Award presentation: Division contest (Nov/Dec 2021)

Eight-80 award Term#2:

a. a. New/Dual/Reinstated Member Registration Criteria- "<u>Eight</u>" Between December 2021 and March 31st, 2022, the club must have added and paid for 8 new or dual or reinstated members. Membership start dates should be December 1st 2021 or January 1st or February 1st or March 1st 2022.

Payments made for membership start date from April 1st 2022 during the above period would not be considered for the same.

- b. Member Retention Criteria- "80%"
 - 1) The Club must have completed the Renewal payments by 31st March 2022
 - 2) The club must have renewed for 80% or over of the existing membership present in the Membership Roster on September 30th 2021. Retention percentage of the club will be computed based on the data available on the TI dashboard/membership roster on March 31st 2022 (Finalized membership roasters of Month of September 2021 Vs Month of March 2022).
 - Clubs meeting the above two criteria (a & b) will be qualified for Season#2 of 'Eight-80".
 - Eligibility: All clubs are encouraged to participate.
 - Cut-off date: March 31st 2022
 - Award Submission by Club not required
 - Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

<u>Club Award – Triple Star Award</u>

- Clubs achieving all the 3 membership building ribbons Smedley Ribbon, Talk up Toastmasters, and Beat the Clock will be presented the Triple Star Award.
- For determining the Beat Clock member addition, data will be computed from the District roster retrieved on May 16th 2022. For the other 2 Ribbons, the winners list published by TI will be considered.
- **Eligibility:** All clubs are encouraged to participate.
- **Cut-off date:** May 15th 2022.
- Award Submission by Club not required
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

Club Award – Beyond Boundaries

• Beyond Boundaries will be given to the Top 3 clubs in District 120 who have the highest number of new/dual/reinstated member addition.

- Eligibility: All clubs are encouraged to participate.
- Award Submission by Club not required
- Cut-off date: April 30th 2022
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

<u>Club Award – Samaritan Club</u>

- President's distinguished Clubs in 2020-21 which helps ineligible / suspended clubs in conducting weekly meetings and help the club get 20 members and help the club in achieving Distinguished club status by Apr 30th 2022.
- The mapping of Helping club and the ineligible clubs to be given by the Division Director by September 15th 2021
- Award Submission by Club not required
- Note: Buddy clubs mapped can work together on the Samaritan award also
- Recognition for the helping club during District 120 Annual Conference, 2022.

<u>Club Award – Platinum Club Award</u>

- Existing Clubs with a member base of 20 or less, gets to 25 members by Apr 30th 2022
- Achieve 5 DCP Points and beyond

Club Award - Gold Club Award

- Existing Clubs with a member base of less than 25 members, gets to a member base of 25 or more by Apr 30th 2022
- Achieve 7 DCP points and beyond
- Clubs receiving the Platinum Club Award, will not be presented the Gold Club Award

<u>Club Award – Quality Club/Golden Gavel</u>

Award is based on a scoring scheme that comprises two categories:

- Club Quality Avenue 100 points
- Club Engagement Avenue 100 points

Quality Club Award:

- When a club achieves 85 or more points in Club Quality Avenue, the club will be presented the Quality Club Award.
- Clubs receiving the Silver Eagle Award or Golden Gavel award, will not be presented the Quality Club Award.
- Eligibility: All clubs are encouraged to participate.
- Award Submission by Club: Not required. It is adequate if the submissions for the various criteria are submitted. Club need not apply separately
- **Cut-off date:** 30th April 2022
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

Silver Eagle Award:

- When a club achieves 120 or more points in total in Club Quality Avenue & Club Engagement Avenue, the club will be presented the Silver Eagle Award. Clubs must achieve a minimum of 55 points in the Club Quality Avenue.
- If the club achieves Golden Gavel, the Silver Eagle Award will not be presented
- Eligibility: Only those clubs with less than or equal to 5 DCP points as on June 30th 2021
- Please refer **Appendix 3** for list of clubs eligible for Silver Eagle award
- Award Submission by Club: Not required. It is adequate if the submissions for the various criteria are submitted. Club need not apply separately
- **Cut-off date:** April 30th 2022
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

Golden Gavel Award:

- When a club achieves 170 or more points in total in Club Quality Avenue & Club Engagement Avenue, the club will be presented the Golden Gavel Award. Clubs must achieve a minimum of 85 points in the Club Quality Avenue & must be President's Distinguished in 2021 2022. Additionally, the club should have one Triple Crown award Winner by Apr 30th 2022 and 60% of club members * should have filed for an education award (except DTM).
- *Education awards filed by members during the term should continue as members as on the cut-off date for eligibility.
- Eligibility: All clubs are encouraged to participate.
- Award Submission by Club: Club need not apply separately. It is adequate if the submissions for the various criteria are submitted.
- Cut-off date: April 30th 2022
- Award presentation: District 120 Annual Conference, 2022

1. DCP Goals

- Maximum of 20 points; 2 points per DCP goal achieved
- Submission by Club: Not required; Data from TI dashboard will be considered.
- **Cut-off date:** Apr 30th 2022

2. Preparation for additional goals

- Maximum of 10 points; 2 points per member
- The level completions that were filed through Club central in TMI website and did not contribute to the DCP goal (not counted for DCP points in dashboard) qualify for the golden gavel points
- Maximum of 5 unique members need to complete any 1 level in Pathways. (Example: A club has submitted 5 "Level 1" completions. Only 4 "Level 1" completions are enough for 1DCP point. The 5th one can be considered for the Additional Goal.)
- Level completions must be filed between July 1st 2021 & April 30th 2022.
- Cut-off date: April 30th 2022
- Submission mode: Upload the filled form to_ https://linktr.ee/D120 HOF awards 2021 2022 at the appropriate section
- Individual submissions by the members will not be accepted

3. Club Success Plan

- Maximum of 8 points; 4 points per half-yearly submission
- Club Success Plan (CSP) must be prepared by Club Officers Team by discussing with the club members. Care should be taken to map the goals to practically achievable dates
- First submission September 15th 2021

• **Second submission** – Jan 31st, 2022; The CSP during the Second submission should mention the goals that have been achieved till date, and what is the plan to achieve the pending goals.

- Evaluation Club Success Plan in the prescribed format available at (Club success plan)
- Cut-off date: September 15th 2021 & Jan 31st 2022
- **Submission mode:** Upload the completed CSP document to_ https://linktr.ee/D120 HOF awards 2021 2022 at the appropriate section

4. Presentations from Successful Club/Better Speaker/Leadership Excellence Series

- Maximum of 6 points; 2 points per presentation
- Total of 3 presentations; one presentation from each of the following:
 - The Successful Club Series (https://www.toastmasters.org/resources/the-successful-club-series-set)
 - The Better Speaker series (https://www.toastmasters.org/resources/the-better-speaker-series-set)
 - Leadership Excellence Series (https://www.toastmasters.org/resources/the-leadership-excellence-series-set)
- Presentations are to be done during a club regular meeting. For effectiveness, it is recommended that the presentation to be done by a senior member of the club or a visiting senior Toastmaster. Presentations should be carried out during different months.
- **Evaluation** Meeting agenda & Evaluation sheet of the presentation
- Cut-off date: March 31st 2022.
- **Submission mode:** Upload the supporting documents for all 3 presentations as one Zip file to https://linktr.ee/D120 HOF awards 2021 2022 at the appropriate section

5. Joint club meetings

- Maximum of 4 points; 1 joint meeting each term; 2 points per joint club meeting
- Area meetings & Special Event with Buddy clubs will not be considered for these criteria.
 There should be an equal representation of role players & speakers from all the participating clubs.
- The first meeting can be online, while the second can be online or in-person meeting
- The first meeting should be with the club outside the home area
- The second meeting should be with the club outside the home division
- First meeting should be conducted between July 1st 2021 and Dec 31st 2021
- Second meeting should be conducted between Jan 1st 2022 and Apr 30th 2022
- **Evaluation**: Meeting agenda, minutes of the meeting, sheet which includes -the participating club names, 5 photographs of meeting in progress.
- Submission to be done only by the hosting club. Points for all the other clubs will be computed from the submission done by the Host club
- The joint meetings should be held with different clubs for both the terms.
- A maximum of three clubs can take part in the joint meetings.

Cut-off date:

- o **Term 1:** Dec 31st 2021

• This is a new initiative to promote camaraderie between clubs and encourage mentoring from clubs outside the home club.

• The Buddy clubs can get a maximum of 25 points.

Identification (3 Points)

Identify a Buddy club and share the name of the club before September 15th, 2021.

- 1. Buddy club should be outside the Area but within District 120
- 2. Two community clubs cannot be Buddy clubs for this award criteria

In case of any challenges in identifying /reaching out to find a Buddy, the clubs can reach out to Area Director / Division Director / CGD Team for any support.

Mentor Mapping (Maximum of 12 Points)

The Buddy clubs are encouraged to participate in each other's meeting and perform roles to understand the members better. The members can identify their potential Mentors / Protégés when they visit the other club

Members can select a second mentor (if they already have one) or chose a mentor for performing a particular role / task in toastmasters. The Mentoring can be for Communication and / or Leadership.

- 1. Map mentors and submit the details by 30th September 2021. Total mentor mentee mapping should be at least 50% of members of the club with least membership or 5 mappings whichever is lower. (However, Clubs are encouraged to have more mentor-protégé mappings than the award criteria)
- a. For example, Club A has 22 members and Club B has 14 members then a minimum of 5 mentor—mentee mapping (50% of club B's strength is 7, but at least 5 is recommended) should be done.
- b. In case club A has 8 members and Club B has 25 members, at least 4 mentor protégé mappings would suffice the award criteria.
- c. The mentors / protégé s can be from either of the club. (For example, to map 5 Mentor Protégé, there can be 3 mentors from Club A mapped to 3 Protégés from Club B and 2 Mentors from Club B mapped to 2 Protégés from Club A. Any combination is allowed).
- 2. Protégé should complete 3 levels or 3 leadership roles or a combination there of (Leadership roles include associate ex com roles, Area extended role, Division extended role, newsletter chair, club contest chair, Joint meeting chair, Themed meeting chair, Special membership campaign chair, roles in any Area / Division /District events) utilizing the mentoring from their Buddy club mentor. In case of extension roles, mentoring to be utilized

for accomplishing a particular task in that role (E.g.: As an Asst. VP Ed, the protégé to help VP Ed fill the roles in at least 4 meetings). The challenges, mentorship guidance received to be documented and submitted.

For every Protégé completing 3 tasks (levels / Leadership roles), both the clubs will be awarded 2 points. If all the protégés complete 3 tasks, remaining points will be given as bonus (In case of clubs with 5 mappings, 2 points will be bonus. In case of clubs with less than 5 mappings, entire remaining points will be given as Bonus).

In case a mentor / a protégé do not renew, a replacement mentor protégé mapping can be submitted. In this case the protégé should complete the tasks in a shorter period and no extension would be allowed. Also, the levels and/or leadership roles should be completed after they have mailed about the mapping. This change can be accommodated only if the members do not renew, any other reason would not be permitted.

Conduct two special meetings. (5 points for each event)

A special event can have one of the following programs in the agenda (Debate / any speech Contest / Panel Discussion / Talent Contest / Special Education Session etc. based on the member's preference)
